



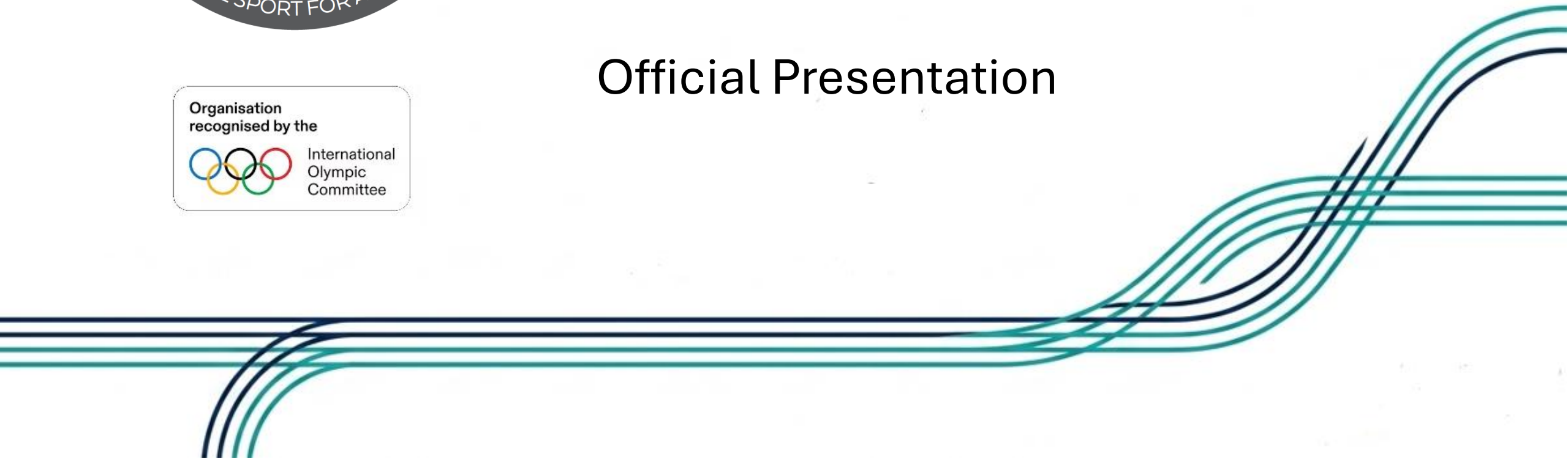

Four Decades of Institutional Evolution



1982 | The Foundation

Founded on April 3, 1982, in Strasbourg at the Council of Europe.



1994–1995 | The Olympic Validation

Provisional IOC recognition achieved in Atlanta (1994); full and definitive recognition communicated by IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch in June 1995.



2009 | The Asian Expansion

Headquarters relocated to the Kingdom of Bahrain, officially registered under the Bahrain Olympic Committee, triggering a new era of global expansion.



2026 | The Modernization

Headquarters transitioned to Rome, Italy, paired with the launch of the sportforall.sport domain and a comprehensive organizational consolidation.

Mission

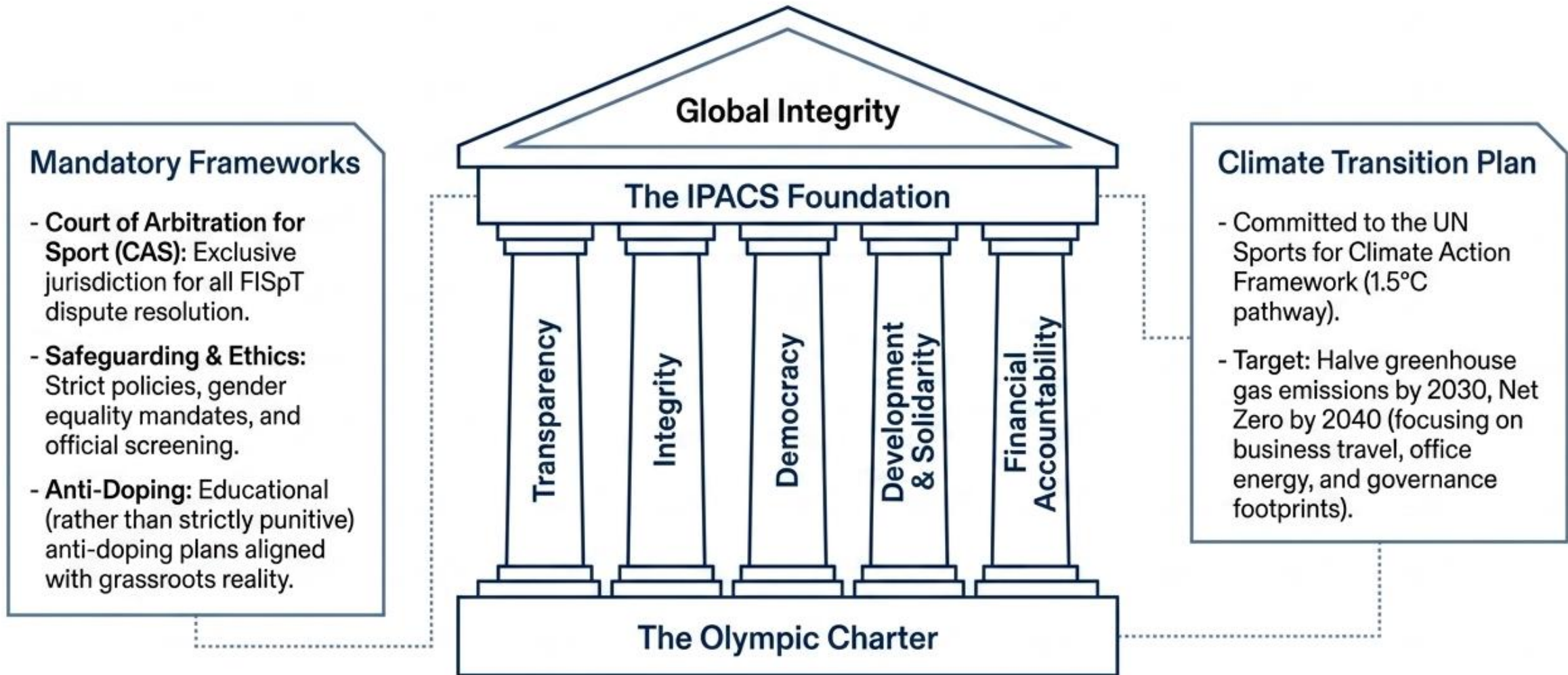

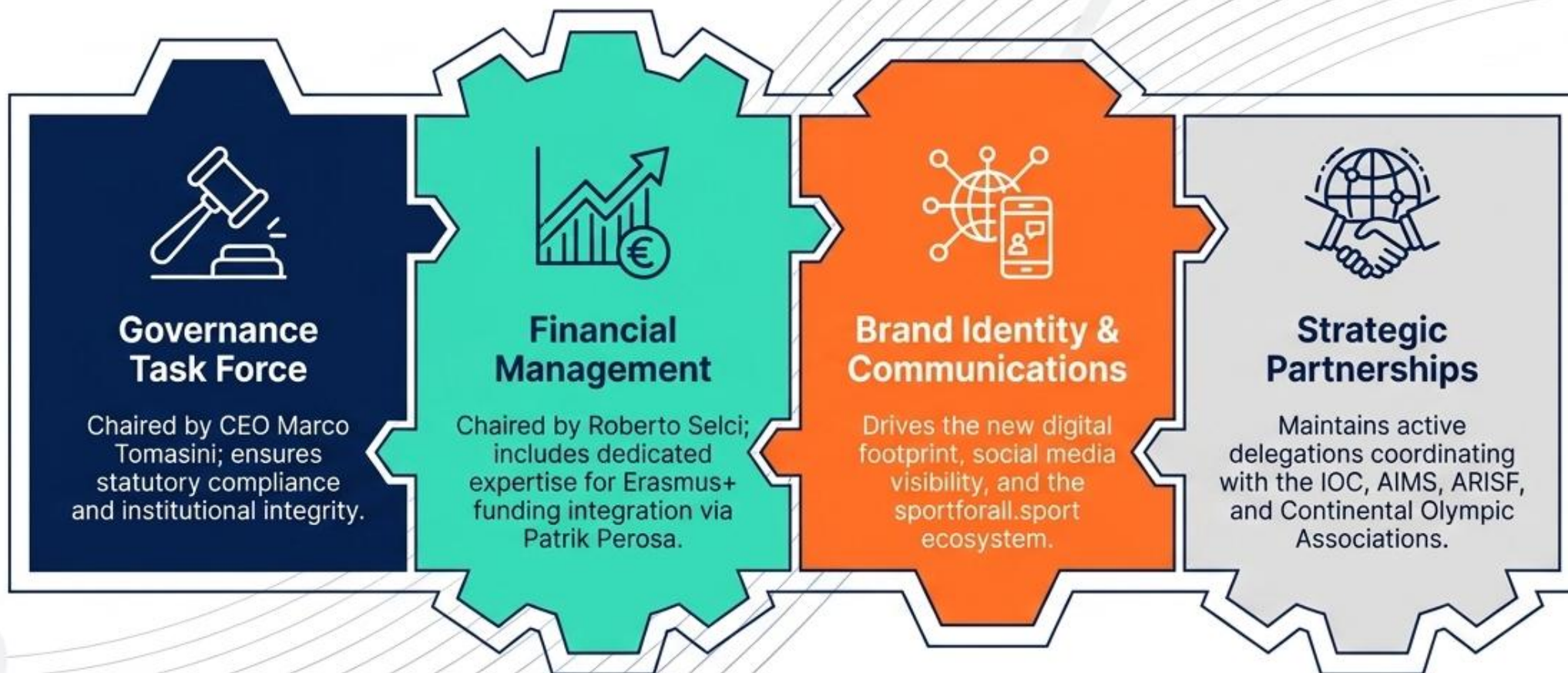

Pathways to Engagement: How to Join



Step 1: Download & Initiate

Acquire official application form via **sportforall.sport**

Step 2: Prepare Documentation

Compile statutes, legal registration, financials, and NOC approval for National applicants

Step 3: Formal Submission

Send written request and compliance declarations directly to the CEO

Step 4: Executive Review

Executive Council evaluates application and requests supplementary documents if required

Step 5: Final Approval

General Assembly vote required for National/Individual Members; Executive Council directly approves Committee/Associate Members

1982
The Foundation in Strasbourg
 FISpT was founded on April 3, 1982, at the Council of Europe, with its first Board of Directors meeting taking place in 1984.



1995
Definitive IOC Recognition
 Following a provisional period in 1994, FISpT was granted full and definitive recognition by the IOC during the 104th Session in Budapest.



2026
A New Chapter in Rome
 After relocating its headquarters to Bahrain in 2009, the Federation officially registered its new central office in Rome, Italy, in January 2026.
